MEETING MINUTES Schell-Vista Fire Protection District Board of Directors Regular Meeting

1. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL AND ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM

Director Loveless called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Directors Joe Petersen, Bob Kruljac, Hal Stober and Ken Finn were present. A quorum was met. Also present were Chief Ray Mulas, Captains John Bragg and Matt Garner, District Account Stacie McCambridge, and Clerk of the Board Robin Woods.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Director Loveless opened the floor for public comments. There were none.

3. AGENDA ADJUSTMENTS AND CONSENT

There were no adjustments to the agenda.

4. CONSENT CALENDAR

a. Approval of minutes from the March 2, meeting- Discussion and Action

Director Loveless opened the floor to public comments and discussion. There were no public comments made. Director Stober made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 2, 2022, meeting. Director Finn seconded the motion. The motion passed, and the Minutes were approved by a vote of Ayes-5 Noes -0 Absent-0

b. Review of the April Accountant's Report-<u>Discussion and Action</u>

Director Loveless opened the floor to public comments and discussion. There were no public comments. Director Kruljac made a motion to accept the Financial Report for April 2022 as presented. Director Finn seconded the motion. The motion passed, and the Financial Reports were approved by a vote of Ayes-5 Noes -0 Absent - 0



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5. CHIEFS' REPORT

Chief Mulas presented the following report to the Board:

"1. The fuel tank has been picked up and is currently being painted at Mulas Dairy Also, I believe the fuel dispensing pump is good; it just needs a little work. I will be taking care of that saving us about another \$1,500.00 dollars.

2. I had the buildings septic system lines all cleaned for a better flow. We have a little Manganese build- up in our system, and it was beginning to choke up our drainpipes throughout the building. Line Locators was our contractor, and they suggested that we install a filter system to help clean out the Manganese before it gets to our domestic water supply.

3.I received a bid proposal for a filter system from Jerry's and Don's pump and well for a filter system between the well and our domestic water supply. Their quote was for \$ 4,493.96, I will provide details of their quote at the meeting."

Chief Mulas presented the Board with the details for the filter. He explained that the filter system quote was \$4493.96. The filter in the system would need to be changed Every 2 years. The floor was opened for comments and questions. There were no Comments or questions from the public.

Director Kruljac made the motion to accept the Jerry's and Don's pump proposal for the New filter system for \$4493.96. Director Stober seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of Ayes-5 Noes-0 Absent-0

"4. The apparatus committee has narrowed down the new type one selection to the lowest bidder which is Pierce. Be prepared for a lengthy discussion on our work in the specifications of this apparatus. Our quotes are good until about mid-April, there will be an additional price increase of 7% in both May and possibly October. Again, we will be able to discuss this at length at the Board meeting."

Chief Mulas presented the Board with 2 quotes for a new Pierce Enforcer, Type 1 Engine. He presented the Board with the details and specifications of each bid. Director Loveless opened the floor for discussion and public comments. Let the record show that there were no public comments.

Director Kruljac made the motion to accept the Golden State Fire Apparatus quote for the Pierce Enforcer, Type 1 Engine for \$890,900.50 along with an additional 10% contingency fee payment. Director Finn seconded the motion. The motion passed with the following vote:

• Wed., Aug. 17, 2022 (83 days before Election Day): Last day to amend or withdraw a measure

• Fri., Aug. 19, 2022 (81 days before Election Day): Arguments are due

• Fri., Aug. 19, 2022 (81 days before Election Day): County Counsel must provide ROV office with impartial analyses of ballot measures

• Fri., Aug. 26, 2022 (74 days before Election Day): Rebuttals are due (only if opposing arguments have already been filed)
